VIVA Levels the Playing Field

- The Virtual Library of Virginia (VIVA) is the consortium of the 71 academic libraries within the Commonwealth of Virginia.
- For 25 years, VIVA has created significant cost savings through cooperative purchasing and resource sharing.
- Since 2018, VIVA has expanded its programs to provide direct support to open and affordable initiatives in Virginia.



VIVA has demonstrated a cost avoidance of over \$1,000,000,000 through group purchases since it began in 1994.



VIVA'S OPEN AND AFFORDABLE COURSE CONTENT INTIATIVE

IN 2019, VIVA launched the Open Grants
Program awarding up to \$30,000 to teams to
adopt, adapt, or create course materials that
are free to students



Lesson #1: The Need is Great

Spring, 2019: 61 applications, requesting \$810,612

Fall, 2019: 44 applications, requesting \$637,765

Spring, 2020: 41 applications, requesting, \$563,986

TOTAL REQUEST: \$2.012 million

AWARDED: \$578,189

ANTICIPATED SAVINGS: \$15 million over five years




